

Lieut. Eisenhower Plots Course

About to be cast ashore after two and a half years of the sailor's life, David Eisenhower seemed a little at sea about his future. Admitting that life in the Navy had "made me restless," the lieutenant junior grade and Presidential son-in-law said: "Now I'm trying to plan for my future. I'm 25 years old and my life's been very structured up to this point. I have to set my course in the next three weeks."

Lieutenant Eisenhower will be released from the Navy in Florida on March 31. He said he had decided not to study law, as his grandfather, President Eisenhower, had recommended, and was thinking in terms of a job in public affairs, or writing a book about his grandfather or perhaps entering journalism.
