

# Frustrated, Says Julie of Father

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Julie Nixon Eisenhower, the President's younger daughter, said today her father is trying to overcome the Watergate scandal and get on with the normal business of his office.

"He has expressed frustration because his achievements at this point in the administration have been overshadowed by Watergate," she said in an interview with Barbara Walters on the NBC-TV "Today" program.

"He's not saying forget about Watergate but is trying to move ahead, hoping that the American people can focus on other important developments as well."

While he "hasn't talked to me specifically about impeachment," she said the possible impact of his resignation has been examined.

"I think it would be a grave mistake for him to resign," she said.

Mrs. Eisenhower, the wife of President Eisenhower's son David, said she has watched the televised hearings of the Senate Select Committee on Presidential Activities on the Watergate incident and described them as "an unfolding mystery."

"There have been a lot of accusations thrown out," she said. "I think the hearings will try to clarify what has happened and will help us get to the bottom of it."
