Julie Eisenhower Nominated for Curtis Post

Julie Nixon Eisenhower has been nominated as a director of the Curtis Publishing Company, publisher of the Saturday Evening Post.

Mrs. Eisenhower, 25 years old, is listed in the proxy statement for the forthcoming meeting of Curtis as one of the seven candidates for the board. As of last Feb. 12, the President's daughter did not own any stock in the company.

The wife of David Eisenhower, grandson of the former President, Mrs. Eisenhower is an associate editor of the Post, earning \$10,000 a year. She joined the company, which reinstated publication of the Post as a quarterly magazine in 1971, last year after working as a

substitute teacher and doing volunteer work.
