

Nixon Photographer Ollie F. Atkins Dies in Washington

Washington, Va.

Ollie F. Atkins, the personal photographer for President Richard M. Nixon from 1969 to 1974, died Sunday at his home here after a long illness. He was 60.

Atkins was a long-time member of the staff of The Saturday Evening Post who also worked for the old Washington Daily News and The Washington Post.

As the presidential photographer, Atkins shot thousands of rolls of film while the Nixon family was in the White House.

Atkins traveled everywhere with Mr. Nixon. Several books of his photographs have been published and a new book, with photos of foreign dignitaries taken during the Nixon administration, is to appear this year.

Atkins was summoned to make pictures of the Nixon family in their private quarters on the former president's last day in office in 1974.
