

Nixon on TV Special Tonight

Richard Nixon interrupts a life of virtual exile tonight to talk about his actions in the Watergate cover-up scandal that drove him from the presidency nearly three years ago.

The first of Nixon's four television interviews with British showman David Frost will be aired by TV stations across the country

nearly five years after the Watergate break-in.

KPIX (Channel 5), KSBW (Channel 8) and KXTV (Channel 10) will carry the 90-minute interview starting at 7:30 p.m. In addition, KPIX plans a 30-minute roundtable discussion of the interview starting at 11:15 p.m.

The former president will get

\$600,000 plus a reported ten per cent of the profits from the syndicated programs.

It will be the first time Nixon has discussed Watergate publicly since he resigned on Aug. 9, 1974.

Since then he has lived in almost unbroken seclusion in his San Clemente (Orange county), villa overlooking the Pacific.
