No arrests or injuries were reported.

About 200 persons on the 11,000-student campus attended a peaceful, one-hour rally at

P.M., someone shouted, "Off pig!" and "Trash Aero-Astro!"
A crowd, that witnesses said included former students and junior high school pupils as well as university students then marched to the Aero-Astro Sciences Building.

Someone shouted, "Double time." The crowd broke into a run, and the first rock crashed into a window.
