HOUSELAUDSRAIDERS WHO SOUGHT P.O.W.'S

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7—The House adopted a resolution today praising those who took part in the unsuccessful effort last month to free United States prisoners of war near Hanoi.

"It is the sense of the House," the resolution adds, that American negotiators be instructed to insist that the prisoners-of-war issue be given "first priority" at the Paris peace talks.

Because it is a House resolution, no Senate action is needed. Also, since it is merely a statement of House sentiment, the resolution is not binding on the Nixon Administration or its peace negotiators.

Antiwar forces in the Senate have strongly criticized the Administration for permitting the military raid at Son Tay, about 23 miles west of Hanoi, on Nov. 21.

The resolution cleared the House by a vote of 347 to 15 after a small band of critics expressed the fear that the move would only encourage the Administration to order more such raids.
