WASHINGTON, Dec. 11 (Reuters) — Significant new information on more than 200 Americans captured or missing in the Vietnam war has been received here from Hanoi through Sweden, United States officials said today.

John F. King, a State Department spokesman, said that Premier Olaf Palme of Sweden obtained the information from the North Vietnamese Government yesterday.

Only about a fourth of the Premier inquired were listed as being in North Vietnamese hands. The previously but un
officially reported deaths of four men in North Vietnam were still being notified.
