P.O.W. Reminders Sent on Holiday

number of wives American prisoners of War in North Vietnam have se-lected their Christmas cards to honor their husbands this

to honor their husbands this year.

One of these wives is Mrs. Jeremiah A. Denton Jr. of Virginia Beach, Va., whose husband, a Navy captain, has been a prisoner in North Vietnam since July, 1965.

Mrs. Denton, the mother of seven children ranging in age from 7 to 23, is a director of the National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia, with headquarters in Washington.

In a telephone interview, Mrspadenton said yesterday that she had designed the Christmas card, which has a photograph of her husband on the cover.

Inside the white greentrimmed card is the following message:

"On this his sixth Christ."

"On this, his sixth Christmas as a prisoner of war, remember him and his com-

remember him and his com-rades there as he joins us in wishing you Peace and joy." Mrs. Denton said that about two months ago she wrote to President Ton Duc Thang of North Vietnam ask-ing permission to visit her husband this Christmas but that she had received no re-

ply yet.
"But I'm still hopeful," she said.
