To Seek Help for P.O.W.'s

12 14 7 GENEVA, Jan. 11 (Reuters)

A five-member group representing the "Concern for Prisoners of War" organization based in San Diego, Calif., arrived here today to see the International Red Cross Committee about prisoners of war in Vietnam.

The group, headed by Lee Dinapoli, a 50-year-old businessman, will get in touch with the United States mission here to fix appointments with Red Cross officials and, possibly, representatives of other Geneva-based international organizations.

"Our aim is to find out what chance there is for the Red Cross Geneva conventions to be applied to American prisoners of war," said Joe MacCain, a member of the group, on arrival at the airport here.
