French Stop Americans In Protest at Hanoi Office

PARIS, Feb. 3 (AP)—Three American students began a letter-reading demonstration in front of the North Viet-namese mission today but were stopped by the French police after about 10 minutes. A plainclothesman told them that if they did not stop, they would be taken to headquarters. It was the third group of Americans concerned with Americans prisoners of war to approach Hanoi's mission in the last five days. The students were from Brigham Young University at Provo, Utah. The letters, which the stu-dents began soliciting last October, asked for return of prisoners, humane treatment, mail rights and Red Cross inspection.
