Freed POW Plans to Look At New Cars

A U.S. army sergeant released by the Viet Cong after two years for captivity plans to look at all the new model cars when he returns to the United States.

Staff Sergeant John C. Sexton Jr., 23, of Warren, Mich., was reported yesterday to be in good condition and eating well after spending his first restful night since he was released near An Loc 60 miles north of Saigon on Friday.

The spokesman quoted Sexton as saying he thought he was dreaming when he reached a government outpost on Friday. "I thought it was just another one of those dreams I had been having in the prison camp," Sexton said.

Asked what he planned to do when he returned home, Sexton said that he wanted to spend a lot of time with his parents and look at all the new cars.

The U.S. spokesman said no date had been set for his return to the United States.
