**More Pilots Reported Captured**

HONG KONG, Dec. 28—The Hanoi radio, in a broadcast monitored here, the North Vietnamese Army newspaper Quan Doi Nhan Dan as having said that more United States pilots had been captured and that no American pilots held in North Vietnam would be freed as long as President Nixon continued the war.

"The more Nixon wants to force his terms on the North Vietnamese people by increasing his air attacks, the longer will be the list of U.S. pilots captured in North Vietnam," the paper stated.

It charged that wave on wave of American planes had attacked populated areas, including a hospital in Than Hoa Province.

So far, China has not reacted to the latest American bombings.
