Special to The New York Times PARIS, Feb. 23—The North Vietnamese delegation to the peace talks confirmed today that Xuan Thuy, the delegation chief, had met Tran Van Do, the former South Vietnamese Foreign Minister, for two hours on Dec. 19. But the delegation insisted that Mr. Thuy had received Mr. Do as a private person "con-sidering that at the present time he does not participate in the administration of Nguyen Van Thieu." The South Vietnamese dele-gation would not directly con-firm that Mr. Do had acted on behalf of President Thieu's Government but pointed to President Thieu's statement last month saying he had asked some South Vietnamese to es-tablish contact with the Com-munists.
