## U.S. REBUFFS HANOI are interested in negotiation,

States delegation to the stalled Vietnam peace talks said today that North Vienam's proposal to resume the conference offers nothing in exchange for its demands.

The proposal by Xuan Thuy, the chief North Vietnamese delegate, was that North Vietnam would bring Le Duc Tho, a high-ranking negotiator, back to Paris on condition that the United States stop its bombing attacks on he North and agree to participate in the regular weekly sessions of he nowsuspended conference.

"There really is no offer at all," Stephen Ledogar, the American spokesman, said. "We of the Politburo, had spent most of the time "lecturing."
