WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Nixon's top national security adviser Henry Kissinger was observed at work in his White House office today.

That helped to end speculation over his whereabouts in view of an expected trip to Paris for possible talks with North Vietnamese negotiator Le Duc Tho.

The White House has said that it does not plan to talk about Kissinger's comings and goings any longer.

But, they broke that two-day rule by announcing that Kissinger and his deputy, Brig. Gen. Alexander Haig Jr., conferred aboard the Navy yacht Sequoia on a Potomac River cruise with President Nixon last night about the situation in Vietnam.

Kissinger was in his office conferring with Haig this morning.
