Allies Still Snub Reds

PARIS — (UPI) — The
United States today rejected
for the fifth time in five
weeks a return to the deadlocked Vietnam peace talks.

U.S. delegation spokesman Stephen Ledogar said the U.S. and South Vietnamese delegations told Hanoi and the Viet Cong they still would not resume the conference until the Communists showed they were willing to negotiate matters of substance.

The Viet Cong delegation asked yesterday for the fifth consecutive week that both the U.S. and Saigon negotiators return to the conference table tomorrow to seek a peaceful settlement of the Vietnam conflict.

The United States and South Vietnam suspended the talks indefinitely May 4 because, they said, neither the Viet Cong nor Hanoi showed any signs of wanting to negotiate seriously.
