McGovern Will Visit Hanoi if Needed

LOS ANGELES, June 7—Senator George McGovern promised today that if elected President he would go to Hanoi or Paris, if necessary, to negotiate an end to the Vietnam war and a release of American prisoners.

He made his statement at a news conference after he was asked how he would fulfill his pledge to end the war and get the prisoners out within 90 days of taking office.

"If it's necessary to go to Hanoi to accomplish that, I'll go to Hanoi to do it," Mr. McGovern said.

"If we can do it in Paris,

I'll go to Paris. I'll go anywhere in the world to meet with the leaders of the Government of Hanoi to work out arrangements for an immediate end to the killing, the safe withdrawal of our forces and the release of our prisoners.

"I don't have any doubt at all that I can accomplish all of that, have the prisoners home, have our troops home and have it done within 90 days."

If other methods work, he will not go to Hanoi, the Senator said, because "there's no point in going to Hanoi just to put on a grandstand act."

President Nixon easily de-

feated Representative John M. Ashbrook of Ohio to win the 96-member California delegation to the Republican National Convention.
