## U.S. May Return to Paris Talks

PARIS — (AP) — The chief U.S. delegate to the Vietnam peace talks returned from Washington today and indicated the United States may end its five week - old boycott of the talks.

Ambassador Willia m J.
Porter told newsmen at Orly
Airport that President Nixon
has been "intensely interested in arriving at some kind
of negotiated settlement of
the Vietnam problem."

"My return here at this time is an additional indication of his strong preference and hope that such a settlement can be achieved," Porter said.

Asked whether he would agree to attend a session of the peace talks on Thursday, Porter said he needed "a little time to assess the situation."

His remarks appeared to be more conciliatory than his usual line.
