

Chinese and Kissinger Talk for 5 Hours

PEKING, June 21—Henry A. Kissinger went to the Great Hall of the People today for two sessions of talks with Premier Chou En-lai and other Chinese officials that lasted a total of five hours and 20 minutes.

Several hours after President

Nixon's national security adviser and his aides left the building, a fleet of 20 Red Flag limousines, used to carry leaders of the first rank, began to arrive at the hall. In view of the late hour and unusually large number of vehicles, it was speculated that a top-level meeting was in progress, pos-

sibly to discuss Mr. Kissinger's proposals.

In the absence of any comment from either side, the intense activity fueled speculation that a major Vietnam peace initiative was under way. Diplomats here remained doubtful, however, that the Chinese would prove any more amenable to the American proposals than they were when the President was here in February.

Jenmin Jih Pao, the Communist party newspaper, appeared today with a photograph of the Presidential adviser and his party posing with the Premier and other leaders. It was displayed in the bottom right-hand corner of the front page, a space that seems to be reserved for items dealing with Mr. Kissinger and his series of four visits. The photograph was taken at a banquet the Premier gave for the Americans yesterday.
