Kissinger:

What's Brewing?

When Henry A. Kissinger, the White House adviser on national security affairs, went to China early last week there was speculation that something was brewing on Vietnam. The speculation was heightened when Soviet President Nikolai Podgorny, en route home from Hanoi, predicted that the Paris peace talks would resume soon.

But as the week wore on, little was said of Mr. Kissinger's activities in Peking or his talks with Premier Chou En-lai and other Chinese officials. And in Paris the deadlock on the talks continued.

Mr. Kissinger quietly returned to Washington Friday and reported privately to President Nixon. Yesterday he gave reporters the word: There was still no indication that North Vietnam was interested in serious talks to end the war, and he had not asked China's leaders to intervene.
