PARIS, Aug. 10 (AP)—The victong delegation to the peace talks insisted today "there is no other way" to end the Vietnam war except for the United States to get out and stop supporting the present Saigon Government.

Mrs. Nguyen Thi Binh, chief negotiator for the Vietcong, stepped up her attacks on the Paris talks. She called it "an administration of repression and terror" that was "set up by the United States to serve as an instrument of "Vietnamization" of the war."

The United States representative at the talks, William J. Porter, earlier told the Communists that their charges of war crimes by South Vietnam and its allies were "unconvincing propaganda, especially when set beside your record of severity and harshness during your current massive offensive."
