..... In 1968 Ellsberg flew to New York with two Rand colleagues and presented Henry Kissinger with a list of "policy options" for the President-elect. One of the options (then not supported by Ellsberg) was "a U.S. commitment to total, unilateral withdrawal by a fixed date ...". One of Kissinger's military aides "disdained even to comment on this one option and at Kissinger's request it was omitted entirely from the second, edited draft that went to the National Security Council." .....
