

**Republicans Hope for
A Viet Peace Break**

MIAMI BEACH — Republicans gathering to renominate President Nixon on a platform claiming he has "restored reason and order and hope" were stimulated yesterday by speculation that some new Vietnam peace break may enliven their 1972 convention.

The speculation was freshened when the President scheduled a Vietnam policy dinner conference at Camp David with Secretary of State William P. Rogers and Presidential Aide Henry A. Kissinger, who has just completed talks with Hanoi and Saigon officials.

The first question was whether any such announcement would go beyond Nixon's expected pre-September disclosure of an additional withdrawal of U.S. troops from South Vietnam.
