Relatives of P.O.W.'s Term  
G.O.P. Plank 'Too Inflexible'

MIAMI BEACH, Aug. 23 (UPI)—In a telegram to President Nixon, the nation's largest organization of relatives of prisoners of war has expressed fear that the Republican platform plank on Vietnam could hinder the prisoners' release.

The National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia termed the language "too inflexible."

The group said it feared that the wording indicated a "hardening" of President Nixon's May 8 peace proposal, which offered to withdraw United States troops from Vietnam four months after an internationally supervised cease-fire in Indochina and return of the prisoners.

Prompting the leagues' telegram on Monday was the insistence in the platform that there be a full accounting of the missing before all American troops are withdrawn. The league is adamant on an accounting, but it feels that it would be difficult or impossible to achieve in the timetable set out.
