

KISSINGER, RUSSIANS PARLEY

Moscow (AP)- Henry Kissinger began meetings with Soviet officials today, but speculation that he would also talk peace with Le Duc Tho of North Vietnam collapsed when Tho flew on to Paris.

The North Vietnamese said on his arrival in Paris that he had not seen Kissinger in Moscow, but he did not rule out an early meeting with him in Paris.

"You will know in a few days," he told newsmen.

Kissinger, President Nixon's adviser on national security, arrived yesterday and was greeted by the Soviet ambassador to the U.S., Anatoly Dobrynin. He told newsmen that "We are here to continue talks," an apparent reference to Nixon's meeting with the Russian in May.

One of the five aides with Kissinger was John Negroponte, a former member of the Paris peace talks delegation who is fluent in Vietnamese.

Tho arrived in the Soviet capital Saturday [9sep] on his way back to Paris. He is a member of the North Vietnamese Politburo and has met repeatedly with Kissinger in Paris.

During the American's three-day stay, Kissinger is to meet with Leonid Brezhnev, the Soviet Communist Party boss, Premier Alexei Kosygin, and foreign minister Andrei Gromyko.

U.S. officials said they would review Soviet-American relations, including European security, Vietnam, the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks and trade..

Kissinger stopped in West Germany enroute and briefed Chancellor Willy Brandt.
