## Hanoi Aides

### 'Would Talk'

## To Kissinger

The North Vietnamese said yesterday they are willing to have another meeting with Henry A. Kissinger, if he wants it.

"If Mr. Kissinger proposes a meeting with Le Duc Tho and Xuan Thuy, they will accept," said a spokesman for the Hanoi delegation to the peace talks here. Thuy is head of the delegation. Tho, a Politburo member, is Hanoi's special adviser on the talks.

Kissinger is due here today.

Yesterday's 159th session of the deadlocked peace talks was marked by a clash over the September 11 declaration by the Viet Cong's provisional revolutionary government on its plan to settle the war.

U.S. Ambassador William J. Porter branded the proposal for a tripartite Saigon government "an undisguised attempt to put the Viet Cong in power in South Vietnam without an election."
