SAIGON AP - Maj. Gen. Alexander M. Haig, special envoy of President Nixon, arrived Sunday in Saigon for talks with top American and South Vietnamese officials, including President Nguyen Van Thieu.

Sources said Haig would give Thieu a full report on the secret peace negotiations in Paris between presidential adviser Henry A. Kissinger and North Vietnamese diplomats. Haig is the number two man on the National Security Council and deputy to Kissinger.

The White House announced earlier that Haig would make what it termed a general assessment of the Indochina situation.

In addition to Thieu, Haig is scheduled to meet with U.S. Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker; Gen. Frederick C. Weyand, commander of U.S. forces in Vietnam, and Gen. John W. Vogt, commander of the 7th Air Force. Newsmen were not permitted to meet Haig on his arrival at Tan Son Nhut Air Base. He issued no statements through the U.S. Command or Embassy.

Haig is scheduled to return to Washington Oct. 4.
