Kissinger Aide Is in Saigon
For Meetings With Thieu

SAIGON, South Vietnam, Oct. 1 (AP)—Maj. Gen. Alexander M. Haig, a special envoy of President Nixon, arrived in Saigon today for a three-day series of meetings with top South Vietnamese and United States officials, including President Nguyen Van Thieu and Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker.

General Haig, the deputy to Henry A. Kissinger, the President's national security adviser, is expected to give Mr. Thieu a full report on the secret peace negotiations held in Paris last week by Mr. Kissinger and

North Vietnamese diplomats. He will also make a general assessment of both the political and the military situation here for a first-hand report to Mr. Nixon. He is scheduled to return to Washington on Wednesday. ← OCT
