

McGovern Set to Specify Peace Plan, Wife Asserts

Washington, Oct. 1 - Senator McGovern told reporters in New York on Sept. 21 that he would "deal with the war, deal with amnesty and I'd deal with the problems of the veterans in a speech marking the fourth anniversary of President Nixon's campaign statement in October, 1968, that "those who have had a chance for four years and could not produce peace should not be given another chance."

[Today] Frank Mankiewicz, the Senator's national political coordinator, reissued without comment a 1952 campaign statement in which then Senator Richard M. Nixon accused Adlai E. Stevenson, the Democratic nominee for President that year, of keeping to himself a plan to end the Korean war.

"If Mr. Stevenson or anyone else in the Truman Administration has a plan to end the war, it should be put into effect now," Nixon's 20-year-old statement said. "The time for ending the Korean war should not be selected on the basis of the effect it may have on an election."
