Viet Peace 1972 Agreement Reported

London

The Times of London reported last night that the Americans and North Vietnamese are believed to have reached "broad agreement" on ending the war in Vietnam.

It said without attribution that the agreement was reached between Henry A. Kissinger, President Nixon's

national security a dviser, and North Vietnamese officials at meetings in Moscow

and Paris.
"The detailed terms of the agreement are not to be completed, or at least not announced, until after the American presidential elections on November 7," said the front-page story by the Times' unidentified diplomatic correspondent.

In Washington, the White House had no comment.

The Times story said: "The North Vietnamese, it is understood, will be glad to accept a coalition government in South Vietnam in which many political groups are represented - including Communists and Communist sympathizers — though not dominated or directed by

them.
"They are confident that to an ultimate Communist takeover."
