2d Biggest Bombing Of North This Year Is Reported by U.S. NYTIMES OCT 1 6 1972 SANCOLATED PRESS. ASSOCIATED PRESS.

SAIGON, South Vietnam, Monday, Oct. 16—The United States command reported yesterday that nearly 400 American fighter-bombers struck North Vietnam with the second heaviest bombardment of the year, while B-52's bombed in all four countries of Indochina.

[In Washington, a highranking official said that there was a "consensus" in the Administration that American bombs were probably responsible for the damage done to the French and other diplomatic missions in Hanoi last week. Page 3.]

The newest bombing by the eight-jet B-52's was directed at suspected enemy positions in Laos, Cambodia, North Viet-nam and South Vietnam, including targets 15 miles from Saigon, the command said.

Smaller fighter-bombers of the Air Force, Navy and Marines were said to have carried out more than 350 strikes Saturday in a wide area of North Vietnam—ranging from the demilitarized zone to the corridor between Hanoi and the Chinese border.

on Aug. 16, when more than 370 strikes were made, the command said.

"We are maintaining our high level of air activity to destroy military targets supporting the invasion of South Vietnam," a command spokesman said.
