**'Assassins Will Stay in Action'--VC**

SAIGON — (CDN) — "Although the war will stop with a cease fire and big guns will fall silent, small guns will remain in action," Viet Cong troops in South Vietnam have been told.

"Such activities as tyrant elimination, abduction and assassination will continue under various disguises," a top-level document circulated by the Communist Central Office for South Vietnam (COSVN) says.

The secret 40-page directive, now in the hands of ranking American and South Vietnamese security authorities, contains a blueprint for continued activity during a cease-fire period.

COSVN distributed the document to Viet Cong forces in the Saigon region and Mekong Delta just one week before Hanoi negotiators appeared in Paris with the now public and agreed-

upon nine-point end-the-war package, American analysts said.

It told Viet Cong troops to prepare for a cease fire before the U.S. presidential election.

"We are determined not to let the war continue for another two or three years," the document says. "The enemies will have to accept a settlement unfavorable to them."

"When there is a political (negotiated) settlement, we must seize every opportunity to attack enemies, expand our control, destroy enemy outposts and raise our flag," the document says.

"If we have no secret armed forces, we will be unable to accomplish anything," the document says. So secret Viet Cong who currently live legally in South

Vietnam with government identification cards are instructed to "remain legal and secret."

They have been instructed to identify government "ring-leaders, tyrants, covert operators" so the Viet Cong can "prevent enemies from murdering and abducting our people."

The COSVN directive also appears to be designed to convince Viet Cong forces that the cease-fire is not a sign of defeat and that the decision to launch the bloody and costly offensive was a good one.
