Hanoi Trip OK For Antiwar Duo

CHICAGO — (AP) — Antiwar activists David Dellinger and Tom Hayden were authorized by a judge today to travel to Hanoi until Nov. 13. The decision said without elaboration the purpose of the journey was to escort U.S. war prisoners home.

Judge Luther Swygert of the 7th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled the pair could leave New York City today and return by Nov. 13.

Hayden and Dellinger, who accompanied a delegation of peace activists to North Vietnam last month to escort three freed POWs home, were not available for comment.

The court said the petition asked the men be allowed to leave for Hanoi Nov. 1 and return Nov. 13 "for the purpose of accompanying prisoners of war back to their families."

Dellinger, Hayden and three other persons were convicted Feb. 18, 1970 of crossing interstate lines to incite rioting in Chicago at the time of the Democratic National Convention.

The five and two other defendants were sentenced by Judge Julius Hoffman of U.S. District Court to serve five years in prison and were fined \$5000 each.

They are free pending appeals.
