CONFERENCE

An international conference to be held 30 days after the cease-fire is expected to provide a later, larger forum for receipt and consideration of the reports, but neither has anything been settled yet on the functions and procedures of the conference, the site, nor the chairmanship.

The members are to be the five permanent members of the United Nations Security Council, Secretary General Kurt Waldheim, and the Vietnamese belligerents.

The U.S. has been resisting an initial suggestion that the conference sit in Paris, primarily because it does not want the chairmanship to go to France.
