# Saigon Raps

## Kissinger

### --A Legend

SAIGON — (UPI) — The government - operated Saigon radio accused presidential adviser Henry Kissinger today of trying "to create a legend for himself" through the Paris peace talks.

The attack underscored reports that President Nguyen Van Thieu is worried about terms of a possible peace settlement in Paris by Kissinger and North Vietnamese politburo member Le Duc Tho.

"... One has good reason to believe that the time has come for Kissinger to gain some wisdom by abstaining from too conspicuously airing his ambitions to create a legend for himself," the radio broadcast said.

"One had the impression that Mr. Kissinger took one or two steps beyond his power to the point of overlapping that of the President whom he is serving. He hurt the U.S. President's prestige with regard to his pledge to respect the South Vietnamese people's right of self-determination."

Vietnamese sources earlier said Thieu sent a letter Sunday to Nixon asking him to receive direct briefings from a Saigon envoy in South Vietnam's stand in the peace talks.
