Kissinger, Tho
Talk for Hour

PARIS — (UPI) — U.S. presidential adviser Henry Kissinger conferred for about one hour today with North Vietnam's chief peace negotiator in a meeting that was neither scheduled nor announced in advance because the two negotiators did not want it publicized.

Vietnamese Communist sources said the meeting was held at Kissinger's request. Neither side gave any details of the meeting.

In Washington, White House press secretary Ronald Ziegler said Kissinger and North Vietnamese negotiator Le Duc Tho would meet again tomorrow in a continuation of their daily meetings that began Monday.

Ziegler said the usual procedure for announcing times for the meetings in advance was not followed for today's session because the negotiators did not want any publicity.

Kissinger also called on French Foreign Minister Maurice Schumann today, Ziegler said.

Earlier, both sides had said no meeting was scheduled today. It would have been the first hiatus in this latest round of negotiations, which began Monday in an effort to find an acceptable peace formula.
