## *Saigon Fights*

### *The Foe With*

#### *Paint Brushes*

SAIGON — (CDN) —

When it comes to fighting Communists, South Vietnam's government has decided that the paint brush is at least as mighty as the sword.

So it was recommended that an anti-Communist slogan be painted outside every house in Saigon, apparently near the saffron and red Vietnamese flag already appearing near the door or gate of almost all residences and business places.

To help, the Information Ministry has compiled a list of 21 approved slogans, any one of which it would be very happy to see displayed outside private homes.

Among the choices: "My Family Does Not Accept the Communists"; "We Support the Present Republic of Vietnam Government Because It Was Elected by Us"; "Wherever the Communists Go There Is Bloodshed"; "Fight Communism to Keep Freedom"; and, "I Want to Live in Freedom."

For people needing help the government apparently is prepared to provide paint and in some cases, even the sign painters.
