# 'Still Major Bars To Viet Peace'

NEW YORK — (AP) — The New York Times\* quoted well-placed administration sources today as saying that the North Vietnamese had made a number of concessions in the recent Paris peace talks but that at least two or three major differences still remain.

The Times said the new provisions in the peace accord include:

- Written agreement that the 39-mile wide, 6-mile deep Demilitarized Zone along the 17th Parallel will be re-established as a buffer zone in which neither side may conduct military operations.

- Agreement that when the cease-fire goes into ef-

fect in North and South Vietnam it will also take effect in Laos and Cambodia and all "foreign" troops will leave both countries.

- An understanding that both the North and South Vietnamese forces may receive any weapons their suppliers are willing to provide.

Sticking points still to be settled, the Times said, include:

- A North Vietnamese demand for the release of tens of thousands of "political" prisoners from South Vietnam jails as part of a troop withdrawal-deactivation formula.

- The specific procedures under which a 5000-man international truce supervisory force would function.
