

# Nixon Lives It Up With Rebozo

KEY BISCAYNE — (AP) — President Nixon escaped the pressures of the Florida White House for a casual night on the town in the Miami suburbs where he dined at a restaurant and visited an ice cream parlor. (DEC)

Nixon ate dinner at a Spanish-style restaurant, "The Hasta," in Coral Gables, with White House counsel Charles Colson and friend Charles G. "Bebe" Rebozo.

The three had Florida seafood delicacies, including cold stone crabs, broiled pompano and crabmeat pate, topped off with a French chablis.

In obvious high spirits, the President chatted with other diners and the chef,

Jimmy Hoo, who was born in China.

"I love the Chinese . . . The Chinese are the ablest people in the world," Nixon said.

Nixon posed for a picture with a man celebrating his 59th birthday and kidded Rebozo saying: "Rebozo's 59; he looks 80."

After dinner, the President visited an ice cream shop that he frequented years ago as vice president.

Rebozo stood in line with early-evening customers waiting to buy what he said was one of the President's favorite treats — coconut ice cream topped with pineapple.

Nixon also signed autographs and chatted with the patrons.
