Our military, in Vietnam, says there is no evidence of a new build-up.

Is it to force the North Vietnamese to negotiate?

They were negotiating, Mr. President, before we resumed bombing.

Is it to bring peace, Mr. President?

Your aide, Henry Kissinger, says peace was 99 per cent achieved, before the bombing began. Now it is no longer "at hand."

Is it to appease President Thieu?

You said nobody will hold a veto over our peace settlement in Vietnam.

Is it to protect our troops?

You know escalating the war has always escalated the danger for our troops, and those of our allies.

Is it to help get the prisoners home?

The number of POWS has increased since the bombing started. And our boys are no closer to home.

Is it to kill more Vietnamese?

We've already killed, by our own count, more than 900,000 of them. Isn't that enough?

Are we really trying to "bomb them back to the stone age"? And us, too?

While you celebrate Christmas with your wife and friends in Key Biscayne, Mr. President, think of the families in Vietnam — mothers, and children, and soldiers who won't celebrate Christmas, or anything else, because we killed them with our bombs this week.

What are we bombing for, Mr. President?
