

Joan Baez' Group Flies To Canton

Vientiane, Laos

Folk singer Joan Baez and three other Americans stranded in Hanoi by American bombing have departed for home via China, sources who arrived here last night from the North Vietnamese capital said.

Diplomats arriving aboard a flight of the International Control Commission said that Miss Baez and her group left on a flight to Canton.

Last night's flight from the North Vietnamese capital was the first ICC plane to reach Hanoi since American bombing of North Vietnam resumed on December 18. Miss Baez and her group entered North Vietnam on December 16, carrying mail for American prisoners of war on a visit that was expected to last one week.

With Miss Baez were Telford Taylor, a Columbia University law professor who served as prosecutor at the Nuremburg war crimes trials following World War II; Michael Allen, assistant dean of the Yale University divinity school, and Barry Romo, a member of Vietnam Veterans Against the War.
