## B-52's Heavily Bomb Enemy Supply Corridor So

SAIGON. South Vietnam, Sunday, Jan. 14 (AP)-United States B-52's bombed sections of an enemy supply corridor stretching more than 150 miles from the North-Vietnamese port

from the North-Vietnamese port of Vinh across the demilitarized zone into the northern tip of South Vietnam, American officials reported vesterday.

But overcast skies cut strikes by smaller American fighter-bombers by almost half to 87 during the 24-hour reporting period ended at 8 AM. Saturday, the United States command said.

The command said that the B-52's, which dropped up to 2,400 tons of explosives in the latest raids, were striking at supply areas and troop positions in efforts to block war materiet and replacements from

While a bombing halt has been in effect above the 20th Parallel, since Dec. 30 while peace talks continue in Paris, acavy strikes have been carried out in North Vietnam daily below the line.
