## More Detail Work On Peace Accord

Paris

U.S. and North Vietnamese experts working on details of the proposed agreement for a Vietnam cease-fire met yesterday for 4½ hours in one of the shortest of their series of almost daily meetings since the beginning of the month.

The two delegations maintained complete secrecy on their discussions.

American sources said that the experts will meet again today and also on Monday. Henry A. Kissinger and Le Duc Tho are scheduled to meet again on Tuesday.

South Vietnamese sources

said that there are several important problems of wording still to be settled, though they indicated, as did government officials in Saigon, that South Vietnam had agreed to accept the cease-fire accord.

South Vietnamese Ambassador Pham Dang Lam told a French source:

"There is no new agreement. It is the agreement of last October which has remained valid. It is the edifice constructed by the two architects, Kissinger and Le Duc Tho, and it's just a matter of furnishing it with a few modifications."
