PRAVDA SAYS SOVIET RUSHED HANOI ARMS

MOSCOW, Jan. 28 (Reuters)
—The Soviet Union rushed some of its weapons, including antiaircraft missiles and fighter planes to North Vietnam to counter the last major United States bombing campaign there, Pravda, the Communist party newspaper, said today.

The Soviet missiles appear to have accounted for the heavy losses of United States bombers in the last phase of the Vietnam war.

A front-page editorial in Pravda extolled the Vietnam peace agreement as a victory for sanity and realism and heavily underlined Soviet aid throughout the war to Hanoi.

"When the imperialist aggressors started bombing the Vietnamese Democratic Republic heavily, the Soviet Union did its utmost to supply the Vietnamese people's army quickly with the latest weapons—antiaircraft missiles, guns and fighter planes," the editorial said.
