Status of 56 P.O.W.'s Unknown to U.S.

 WASHINGTON, Jan. 29 (AP)—Fifty-three Americans known to have been prisoners of war in Southeast Asia remain unaccounted for by North Vietnam, Pentagon spokesman said today.

The spokesman, Jerry W. Friedheim, said that an initial alphanumeric analysis indicated that there were "56 men" on our list of prisoners of war who were not on lists received from the North Vietnamese and Vietcong.

Officials said that these men were known to have been alive at Communist prison camps at one point during the war. "We don't have any further information about them at this point," Friedheim said. He added, however, that a list of the missing and captured in Laos was expected shortly.

Lists Turned Over
 "We're continuing to seek information on that through diplomatic channels" in Paris, Friedheim said, and also through the Four-Party Joint Military Commission.

Two lists turned over to United States officials in Paris last May by the Communists included 555 American servicemen captured in North and South Vietnam and 55 who died. There were no clues to the whereabouts of 1,269 men now listed by the Pentagon as missing in Southeast Asia, in-

cluding more than 300 lost in Laos during air strikes against Communist supply routes.

Mr. Friedheim pointed out that the total of all American military prisoners and missing had been revised to 1,935 men—including 555 awaiting release from prison camps in North and South Vietnam, 55 prisoners who died, 56 still unaccounted for and 1,269 carried as missing.

List of Men From Area

Following is an updated list of names of United States servicemen from New York, New Jersey and Connecticut identified as prisoners of war. All the names appear on the official lists that were handed over to United States officials in Paris Saturday by the North Vietnamese and the Vietcong. These lists, which the Pentagon began to make public Sunday as next of kin were notified, provide only names, services and ranks of the men. Additional information such as home towns and dates of capture comes from the files of United Press International and The Associated Press, based on a variety of sources, including lists provided over the years by anti-war groups, broadcasts by the Hanoi radio and reports of foreign correspondents.
