Cease-Fire Violations Said to Be Minor

SAIGON, South Vietnam, Monday, Feb. 5—Only isolated minor incidents broke the truce in South Vietnam yesterday as the cease-fire moved into its second week.

For the second straight day, South Vietnamese military authorities reported that there was "no significant action" anywhere in the country.

They also said there was a continuing decline in the number of Communist cease-fire violations, charging that there were only 18 such incidents between 6 A.M. and noon yesterday.

That was by far the lowest stumber of violations charged by the South Vietnamese for any comparable period since the cease-fire went into effect.

The new allegations brought the Communist violations to 1,585. The Communists have also charged a pattern outlined with what to 102.
