

Yanks in Haiphong To Discuss Mines

The United States and North Vietnam met in Haiphong today to discuss detailed plans for removing American mines from the Communist country's harbors and waterways.

Rear Admiral Brian McCauley, who will direct mine-sweeping operations, flew to Haiphong with 14 other senior American officials to meet with the Hanoi delegation.

Military officials said the task of clearing mines from North Vietnamese harbors would begin "as soon as possible."

The group flew to Hanoi aboard a C130 Hercules transport plane. It was the eighth American plane to arrive in North Vietnam since the cease-fire eight days ago. The delegation was taken the 55 miles east to Haiphong by North Vietnamese transportation.
