NEWSMEN BLOCKED

AT TRUCE-UNIT SITES

SAIGON, South Vietnam, Feb.
5 (UPI)—Attempts by newsmen to cover the first deployment of Vietnam truce inspectors were blocked at at least three of the sites where the cease-fire teams arrived today.

In Da Nang, correspondents were barred by South Vietnamese and American military policemen from access to the city's air base during the arrival of Canadian, Polish, Hungarian and Indonesian members of the International Commission for Control and Superior Control and Superior sion for Control and Supervi-

sion for Control and Supervision.

At Pleiku in the Central Highlands, American military policemen prevented a correspondent from entering the United States Army Signal Corps compound where the supervision team is quartered and harassed him as he waited outside for the arrival.

At My Tho, 34 miles southwest of Saigon, correspondents were blocked from entering a section of the South Vietnamese Army's Dong Tam base where the first Communist members of the joint military commission's regional inspection team were quartered.
