The sources said one of the main difficulties holding up an agreement — that of the composition of a provisional government — had been solved.

The future of the 50,000 or so North Vietnamese troops in Laos was also not clear, although informed sources have said this would not cause trouble as it had in negotiations for a cease-fire in Vietnam.
